Background


Cluttered Background




Clean Background



- 1. Find uncluttered background
- 2. Blur it with large aperture



4. Use telephoto lens

Approx. 20-30 degrees










Best Angle depends on:

- Best Background










- Silly faces
- People don't like being photographed




10 TIPS FOR DISCREET PORTRAITS

- From a distance, with a telephoto lens
- From an angle, not in front of your subject
- Hide behind something (or someone)
- Move to a shadow
- Sit down
- When your subject is talking to someone
- When your subject is talking to your friend
- Pretend to take picture of your friend
- Use flip-screen to avoid pointing camera at your subject
- Don't hold your camera up forever

Posed Candid





- Connection
- People make silly faces
- People don't like being photographed

- Natural, authentic expression
- Need telephoto lens
- Avoid being seen





HOW TO FIND A GREAT SUBJECT

• Look around. Keep your eyes open to find interesting people around you

- Look 20-30m ahead
- Get away from main path



HOW TO CAPTURE ELUSIVE MOMENTS

Have your camera in people settings, ready to react fast

Anticipate & wait

- How much time do you have?
- How long is your subject there?
- How likely is elusive moment?

CLOSING COMMENTS

GREAT PHOTOS STRAIGHT FROM CAMERA

- Find great Light
- Get correct Colour (White Balance)
- Get correct Exposure
- Framing & Clean Background
- Keep checking your pictures as you shoot

GETTING SHARP PHOTOS

- Shutter Speed 2x focal length
- Select focus point manually
- Continuous shooting
- Half-press the shutter until the camera focuses
