


## Direct light

#### Front-Side



Angle 20-30 degrees

Softer light Women

Clean

Background

## Clean Background

- 1. Find uncluttered background (move left or right)
  - One colour
  - Contrasting with subject
  - Ideally darker than subject
  - Leave distractions outside frame or behind subject
- 2. Blur it with large aperture

4. Use telephoto lens

## Clean Background




Zoom in to leave distractions outside



**Shoot upwards** from lower angle



Make background black with more light on subject

More Imposing (lean forward)



More Dynamic (diagonal lines)

More Relaxed (lean back)


Fill the Frame

- Eye contact




# Different Angles



**Get Low** *Make people taller* 

## Best Angle depends on:

- Most unique & surprising perspective
- Best Direction of Light
- Clean Background



People don't like being photographed Artificial expression / silly faces


Natural expression

- Reflection in the eyes











#### 8 INTERACTION COMMANDMENTS

#### DO:

- Put them at ease. Compliment. Music
- Be very specific what you want them to do
- Ask them to change position / expression frequently
- Keep showing them the pictures
- Talk to them

#### DON'T:

- Don't ask to smile
- Don't tell them to hold/freeze
- Don't criticise. Always turn it into a positive

#### TALK TO YOUR SUBJECT

- Ask what they love & talk about that kids? pets?
- Favorite food / restaurant?
- Last / next vacation?
- What are their dreams?
- Their passions?
- Make a fool of yourself





#### 10 TIPS FOR DISCREET PORTRAITS

- From a distance, with a telephoto lens
- From an angle, not in front of your subject
- Hide behind something
- Hide behind your companion
- Move to a shadow
- Sit down
- When your subject is talking to someone
- Pretend to take picture of your companion
- Use flip-screen to avoid pointing camera at your subject
- Don't hold your camera up forever



## Interaction

- People are more expressive when they interact with others
- And they are less likely to see you



# CLOSING COMMENTS

## GREAT PHOTOS STRAIGHT FROM CAMERA

- Find great Light
- Get correct Colour (White Balance)
- Get correct Exposure
- Clean Background
- Keep checking your pictures as you shoot

## GETTING SHARP PHOTOS

- Shutter Speed 2x focal length
- Select focus point manually
- Continuous shooting
- Half-press the shutter until the camera focuses
